AQHA Entries – must include a copy of your horse registration papers and a copy of your membership card.

Membership - AzVRHA annual membership is required to participate. You are invited to attend (1) Versatility clinic prior to joining WSVRHA. You must be a WSVRHA member to participate in the competition.

Cancellation Policy: 7 days or more-100% refund; 6 days or less no refund of cattle fees, less than 24 hours' notice, NO refund. If you reserve cattle and do not cancel by April 17th you will be required to pay the cattle fees. AZVRHA reserves the right to cancel an event at any time if safety becomes an issue. Refund will be determined by expenses.

Anchor Cross Ranch

Bio - Security Policy

1. Horses coming to any Anchor Cross Ranch event must NOT have a fever. **If your horse seems at all the least bit “off”, please leave him at home.**
2. There will be **NO** community watering troughs. All horses must be watered at their trailers with their own bucket or in their assigned stalls **ONLY**.
3. When using a water hose, DO NOT put the hose into the water bucket.
4. Tie horses at your own trailers or in assigned stalls. No tying to any fences or posts.
5. Do not allow horses to nose or sniff each other.
6. You may provide plastic barrier fabric between stalls if you desire.
7. Please refrain from touching any horse other than your own, especially horses that are boarders of Anchor Cross Ranch.
8. Use of hand sanitizers is encouraged (these should contain 62% ethyl alcohol).
9. Please clean up around your trailer and dispose of in designated compost areas.
10. All horses are subject to random temperature check any horse with a fever of 102 F or greater will be asked to leave immediately.

It is understood that some (most) horses with a fever will not have EHV-1; however, in the interest of conducting a safe event under the current circumstances, the no fever policy will be enforced. If you do not wish to comply with these safety measures please do not attend the event.

ANYTHING that touches an infected horse or carries secretions or manure from sick horses has the potential to transfer pathogens to other horses
